PARTICIPATORY BUDGET

Renfrewshire Council are organising a Participatory Budgeting information and recruitment session for young people.

Participatory budgeting (PB) is a democratic process in which community members decide how to spend part of a public budget. PB is recognised internationally as a way for people to have a direct say in how local money is spent.

Celebrating Renfrewshire is a fund which is designed by a young person led steering group, using a participatory budgeting approach. Having young people engage in this process is vital to ensure the needs of young people across Renfrewshire are being met through the projects that receive funding.

All interested young people aged 12 – 25 are invited to attend the Youth Participatory budgeting information and recruitment event on **Wednesday 28th of February 2024 from**
